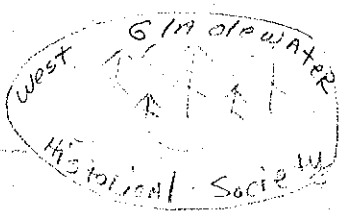


SHEPPERD HERITAGE HOUSE - *larger*

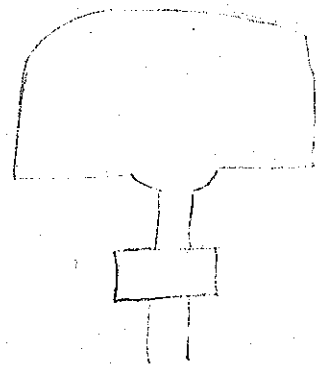


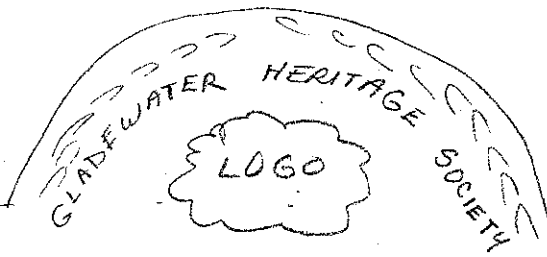
