The Winterfield Methodist Church in Longview was formed in 1883 in the Winterfield Community of Gregg County. As was the custom in those days the church soon acquired adjacent land for a cemetery. An Official Texas Historical Marker for Winterfield Methodist Church was dedicated October 6, 1995. What follows is a description of Winterfield Cemetery for the purpose of applying for an Official Texas Historical Marker for Winterfield Cemetery.



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Biographical information about Rae Barner who researched this information

Mrs. Garner's husband, Howard Garner, is a descendent of a pioneer Winterfield community family. Although not a native Texas, Rae has done a mammoth work for Texas and Gregg County. She almost single-handedly searched for and found all known caucasian cemeteries in Gregg County. She then listed all burials located. This information was published in five volumes by the Gregg County Genealogy Society and are for sale at the Longview Public Library.

Obituaries are read and burials recorded on a daily basis at the Longview Public Library for future publishing. The Gregg County Historical Commission does not have these volumes.

Mrs. Garner also compiled the Winterfield Cemetery Book which was published by the East Texas Genealogical Society in Tyler, Smith County, Texas in 1986. The Gregg County Historical Commission has one of the 150 copies which were printed.

WINTERFIELD CEMETERY
Longview, Texas

Winterfield Cemetery is an old country cemetery living in the modern times. Located about three miles north of Longview, on Tryon Street, across from the Winterfield United Methodist Church. It is the resting place of about 500 settlers of the surrounding Winterfield community (a part of Longview), many who were farmers, productive men in their chosen fields, official men serving the city and county in official capacities such as Justice of the Peace, Precinct commissioner, Sheriff, Deputy Sheriff, religious men who served their church well in the capacity as Music Director, Sunday School Superintendent. One man, Jacob Belton Lagrone was one of the Founders of the Noonday Holiness Camp near Hallsville, Harrison county, Texas on Oct 15, 1898. Another man, Goin Bell Richardson was one of the original trustee board members of the Winterfield church in the 1880's at the formation of the church.

Location of the cemetery is approximately 3/10's of a mile off Eastman Road. It is a well-kept cemetery, continues to be in full use to this day. It measures approximately 286' by 240'. Surrounded by a cyclone fence in front with two driveway entrance gates, wire fence on the sides, and a wooden board fence in the back of the cemetery. A wrought iron overhead sign lets all know that this is Winterfield Cemetery.

Located on farm property originally purchased by July and Martha HOWARD GARNER from Nancy RICHARDSON on Jan 29, 1879, it has provided a resting place for many descendants. Original burials in this cemetery include four small children, Joel S. BRIGHT, son of George L. and Lucy R. WEBB BRIGHT, niece of July and Martha HOWARD GARNER, who died Nov. 1, 1887. Jessie L. WEBB, daughter of Joe and Sarah HOWARD WEBB, sister of Martha HOWARD GARNER, who died Nov. 9, 1887. Another child, an infant some of William J. and Virginia CULVERHOUSE GARNER, nephew of July GARNER died Feb 8, 1890. And A. B. BRIGHT, daughter of Oliver and Dor BRIGHT, died Nov 18, 1890.

The first adult burial was sarah SMITHERMAN FULGHAN, born July 21, 1812, died Dec 22, 1889. She was the mother-in-law of William Jackson GARNER, brother to July GARNER.

A note of interest, three of these old markers, Joel BRIGHT, Jessie WEBB, and Sarah FULGHAN are facing the west end of the cemetery instead of the traditional east. All other older markers are in the customary places.

July GARNER, born July 14, 1842 in Bibb Co, Ala, died May 3, 1913, is buried at Mt. Bethel Cemetery, Garbage, Panola county, Tx., while is wife Martha HOWARD GARNER, born May 28, 1842 in Tuscaloosa Co, Ala, died Dec. 4, 1923 is buried next to they only child Evans Howard and Murrilla SHOUTS

GARNER. Since them, many descendents of both July and Martha HOWARD GARNER and William Jackson and Rebecca FULGHAM GARNER have been laid to rest in this old cemetery.

In early 1900's, the graves were kept clean by family members who, with their hoes and rakes, allowed not one weed or a blade of grass to grow over the dirt mounds. They assembled as often as need to perform this loving task for their loved one,

Cedar trees were planted along the driveways in the 1920's, giving the area some shade, bushes planted among the plots for beautification. According to Bedford Bardwell, one of the Sextons of the Winterfield Cemetery Association, many years ago, graves were dug 6 feet deep to accommodate the wooden coffins with rocks on the bottom of the grave site for drainage. Now the procedure is done by machinery 4 feet deep with a concrete vault placed in the site.

Gregg County Precinct 2 Commissioners were responsible for the care of the cemetery at least twice a year to keep the grounds cleaned. On Sep 9, 1971, according to information from the president Frankie Butler of the Winterfield Cemetery Association, the Association was formed for the purpose of maintaining the grounds with perpetual care covered by yearly donations. Meetings are held yearly, the third Saturday in May, with business details discussed, then an informal set-down covered dish dinner. After which, all are invited to walk over to the Cemetery to see the grounds.

It is hoped that in the next hundred years, this old country cemetery will continue to receive the care and respect from others that it has been received in over the past one hundred and eight years.

WINTERFIELD CEMETERY ASSOCIATION

The Winterfield Cemetery Association was first formed according to available records on September 9, 1971. Prior to this, Gregg County had the responsibility of the upkeep of the cemetery grounds. Officers elected at this time, served temporarily until an official election could be held at the first Winterfield Cemetery Association meeting on the third Saturday of May of the following year.

Serving at this time: President, Frankie Butler, vice-president, Ruby Strong, treasurer, Louise Corley. Marvin Richardson and Hollie Richardson served as caretakers of the cemetery. Their responsibilities were arranging plots for burials, care of the mound after burial, keeping the markers and areas cleaned of weeds, rocks, etc.

At the Association meeting in May, 1972, the elected slate of officers were: President, Frankie Butler, vice-president, Ruby Strong, treasurer, Mary Ann McWhorter, and secretary, Charlotte Hawkins. Officers elected in May 1977 to serve were: President, Gladys Moore, vice-president, Frankie Butler, secretary, Charlotte Hawkins, and treasurer, Mary Ann McWhorter.

The Board of Directors included Marvin Richardson, Bedford Bardwell, Morgan McWhorter, Iva Moore, Ruby Strong, and as honorary member, Roy Richardson.

When Roy Richardson was unable to fulfill his obligations as the caretaker of Winterfield Cemetery due to health problems, Marvin Richardson, Bedford Bardwell and Morgan McWhorter served as acting caretakers for many years.

At the Association meeting on May 15, 1981, the following officers were approved: President, Frankie Butler, vice-president Ruby Strong, secretary, Charlotte Hawkins, and treasurer, Mary Ann McWhorter. Morgan McWhorter and Bedford Bardwell were appointed as caretakers of the cemetery as both Marvin Richardson and Roy Richardson had passed away.

April 1, 1982, the Winterfield Cemetery Association received their Charter of Corporation from the State of Texas.

In January 1986, the slate of Officers included: President, Frank-
le Butler, vice-president, Ruby Strong, secretary, Charlotte Hawkins,
and treasurer, Mary Ann McWhorter. The Board of Directors for this term
consist of Charlotte Hawkins, Mary Ann McWhorter, Bedford Bardwell, Mor-
gan McWhorter, Iva Moore Neale, and Billy Tom Smelley. Bedford Bardwell
and Morgan McWhorter continue as caretakers of the cemetery.

The annual Winterfield Cemetery Association meeting is held in May
on the Saturday after Mother's Day. Members are notified at least 30
days in advance of the meeting. Yearly donations from members are used
for the administration and upkeep on the cemetery. The meeting is held
at the Fellowship Hall of Winterfield United Methodist Church and a cov-
ered dish dinner is served prior to the business meeting.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

When July G. and Martha Ann Howard Garner purchased about fifty acres of land from Mrs. Nancy Harrison Richardson on January 29, 1879, the property was located in the Winterfield community, near what is now Tryon Road.

On November 1, 1887, a nephew, Joel S. Bright, son of George L. and Lucy Rebecca Webb Bright, died. On November 9, 1887, a niece Jessie L. Webb, daughter of Joel W. and Sarah Jane Howard Webb, died. These two children were related to July and Martha Garner, so were laid to rest in a portion of the Garner farm, later to be used as a family cemetery. The first adult burial was Sarah Smitherman Fulgham, 77 years old, who died July 22, 1889. She was the mother of Rebecca Caroline Fulgham Garner, the wife of William Jackson Garner, who was a brother of July G. Garner.

Throughout the years, many family members have been laid to rest in this old country cemetery. Old-timers can recall many cedar trees, alpha bushes, some plants, that were abundant on the sandy burial grounds. As the cemetery grew larger, a cemetery working party was convened with brooms and rakes, known as sweeping the cemetery, this was done annually. After the work had been finished, dinner-on-the-ground, followed with fellowship enjoyed by all family members.

This same fellowship prevails today with the annual Cemetery Association meetings held each May on the Saturday after Mother's Day.

Please note that from the marker to the notebook to the final printed copy, mistakes may have been made. Any corrections or additions would be appreciated.

I.

ALL ELECTED OFFICERS MUST HAVE RELATIVES BURIED IN WINTERFIELD CEMETERY.

II.

THE TREASURER AND ANOTHER ELECTED OFFICER MUST SIGN ALL CHECKS WRITTEN.

III.

ON OR BEFORE THE FIRST DAY OF MAY OF EACH YEAR, NOTICES WILL BE SENT TO ALL SURVIVING RELATIVES OF LOVED ONES BURIED IN WINTERFIELD CEMETERY.

IV.

A MEETING SHALL BE HELD AT LEAST ONCE EACH YEAR WITH THE SECRETARY AND TREASURER GIVING THEIR YEARLY REPORT. ALL OFFICERS, BOARD MEMBERS AND PERSONS WHO HAVE MADE DONATIONS WILL BE NOTIFIED OF SAID MEETING. ALL OFFICERS WILL BE SUBJECT TO A CALL MEETING AT ANY TIME. YEARLY MEETING WILL ALWAYS BE THE THIRD SATURDAY OF MAY.

V.

FROM THIS DATE FORWARD, MAY 14, 1977, NO CONCRETE CURBS OR ANY KIND OF ORNAMENTAL OBJECTS SHOULD BE AROUND GRAVES.

VI.

FROM THIS DATE FORWARD MAY 14, 1977, ALL PERSONS BURIED MUST HAVE STATIONARY MARKERS.

VII.

NO TREES OR SHRUBS SHALL BE PLANTED IN THE CEMETERY. WILTED AND FADED FLOWERS WILL BE REMOVED FROM GRAVES.

VIII.

BEFORE ANY GRAVE CAN BE OPENED, A BOARD MEMBER MUST BE CONTACTED.

IX.

THE THIRD SATURDAY OF MAY OF EACH YEAR A COVERED DISH DINNER WILL BE HELD.

X.

IF A COMMITTEE MAN STRAIGHTENS A MONUMENT FOR ANYONE, HE WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DAMAGE THAT MIGHT OCCUR.

XI.

ALL CLOTH OR WOODEN CASKETS MUST HAVE A GRAVE LINER OR A CONCRETE BOX WITH LID. ALL METAL CASKETS ARE ACCEPTABLE WITHOUT VAULTS.

XII.

LOTS THAT REMAIN WITHOUT MARKERS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY TO THE DESCENDANTS OF THE FAMILIES ALREADY BURIED IN THE CEMETERY

We have been unable to locate the record needed to answer this inquiry. If the record were here on July 12, 1973, it would have been in the area that suffered the most damage in the fire on that date and may have been destroyed.

Fortunately, a number of alternate sources of information exist which enable this Center to reconstruct service record data lost in the fire. We will attempt to obtain the required information from these sources if you will assist us by completing the questionnaire on the reverse side of this letter. It is important to remember that we need all possible information that you can furnish. In addition, it will be helpful if you will enclose copies of any papers you may have relating to the military service, such as military orders, award citations, military addresses, and other related materials.

If, however, your request is for medals only, and you can send us a copy of your report of separation (DD Form 214, WDAGO Form 53-55, etc.), we will not need the completed questionnaire, or any other military papers.

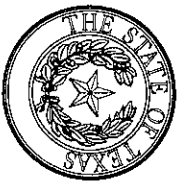
